Technology is revolutionizing and redefining the way we live, yet women are currently under-represented in telecommunication/ICT design, development, and governance. While progress has been made, the meaningful and effective participation of women and girls in field of telecommunications/ICTs, from decision-making to implementation, as well as the integration and mainstreaming of gender equality continues to be a major challenge.

The ITU Plenipotentiary Conference 2022 (PP-22) will be the first gender-responsive Plenipotentiary. The ITU aims to reach the target of at least 35% of women participants, up from to 22% of women participants at PP-14, and 29% at PP-18.

Participation goes beyond numerical representation - it is about the extent to which women are empowered to actively engage and influence outcomes. This is why the ITU, with Australia's support, has developed and delivered a training programme to prepare women delegates to take an active role in PP-22 and beyond.

Over 100 women delegates benefited from the training. The training, underscored by the need to advance gender equality and the empowerment of women in the telecommunications/ICTs field, focused on bolstering the capacity of women delegates to meaningfully engage in the activities of the ITU including the Plenipotentiary Conference.

This High-level Panel and Networking Breakfast will bring together women VVIPs/VIPs representing the 6 ITU regions, the trainees, and those committed to bridging the gender digital divide to highlight the importance of advancing women's leadership in telecommunications/ICTs, as well as in the work of the ITU.
